

Winter Vaccinations 2024/25 and Spring Summer Vaccinations 2025

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Introduction



The Winter Vaccinations Team at NHS Greater Manchester (GM) are part of the Population Health directorate and support system-wide delivery of seasonal vaccinations for COVID-19 and Influenza.

We work with Primary Care Networks, Community Pharmacies and Hospital Trusts to plan and coordinate activity within the National programme. We monitor vaccine supply into the system and gain delivery assurance from delivery sites.

We also fund extended services schemes aiming to widen access to seasonal vaccinations, including mobile services, outreach to places of worship, homelessness services and promotional materials.

- Care home uptake appears to have dropped.
- There are known data issues which are being worked through with national teams.
- There are over a 1,000 care home beds missing vaccination data for GM on FDP.
- We are trying to gather feedback on general attitude to vaccine from care home residents, to inform the evaluation and planning for spring 2025 and AW25

- There are some known data issues.
- Illustrates the same theme of drop in uptake seen across all cohorts.
- In previous years, this would be the highest uptake cohort.
- Appears to still have higher uptake rates than COVID-19 vaccinations.

 Usually, they are the most compliant cohort.
- Is this due to introduction of RSV or delayed start to the programme?
- Do we need more comms around why Flu vaccine should be given later?

Eligibility for Covid vaccination Spring Summer 2025




- JCVI advises the following groups should be offered the COVID-19 vaccination from 1st April 2025;
- Adults aged 75 and over
- Residents in a care home for older adults
- Individuals aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed (as defined in the "immunosuppression" sections of tables 3 and 4) https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-the-green-book-chapter-14a

The last day of the Spring programme will be 17th June 2025.

266,007 total eligible residents


11,671 care home residents210,157 adults aged 75 and over44,179 immunosuppresed

There is no early start for the care home and housebound cohorts for Spring 2025, all cohort vaccinations will commence 1st April 2025.

A new procurement process was undertaken to identify any gaps in provision for the care home and housebound cohorts, this has almost been completed, and providers are being commissioned.

Designated Delivery Sites – Map View





399 total delivery sites

- 354 CPs
- 45 PCNs
- HHs not vaccinating during the Spring/Summer programme
- PCNs are identified in blue, CPs in Green – total volume of CPs is much greater than PCNs although PCNs will likely achieve around 50% of the total activity
- Sufficient coverage across the GM footprint
- Risk of waste due to the high volume of sites

Communication Approach - Spring

MHS
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- Objective is to inform and encourage COVID-19 vaccinations among over 75-year-olds and care home residents using no-cost or budget-friendly communication strategies.
- Increased education to staff in care home.
- Communication Preferences:
 - Clear, simple language
 - Face-to-face promotion
 - Written materials from national
 - Paper copies of leaflets are available to order for free or download in 29 languages. With a Braille version and easyread resources available.
- Communication Channels Organic Promotion Strategies:
 - Texts, Posters, VCSE advocacy, Digital media promotion (social media and websites), news outlets.
 - Promotion of the pop-up clinics and outreach offers via digital platforms.





Locating Sites/Booking Vaccinations

Booking vaccinations can be done via:

- NBS (National Booking System) opens to the public 25th March 16th June
- LBS (Local Booking system from GP/PCN)

Other Adult Immunisations



Pneumococcal, Shingles and RSV Vaccinations

- Uptake in all adult immunisations has dropped.
- RSV vaccine new programme introduced September 2024 for those:
- aged 75 years of age on or after 1 September 2024 (that is, with a date of birth (DOB) on or after 1 September 1949). These individuals should be vaccinated on or after (but not before) their 75th birthday
- adults who are aged between 75 and 79 years of age on or before 1 September 2024 (DOB between 1 September 1945 and 31 August 1949). Such individuals remain eligible up to the age of 79 years and 364 days (in other words, up to and including the day before the individual's 80th birthday)
- adults who turn 80 years of age between 2 September 2024 and 31 August 2025 (DOB between 2 September 1944 and 31 August 1945) remain eligible up to and including 31 August 2025
- RSV, Shingles and Pnemococcal vaccines are year-round programmes and people should attend straight way when invited.
